### Brothers & Sisters Homes

The Holland Deacons' Conference maintains homes for individuals with varying degrees of cognitive disabilities. There are separate homes for women and men. Each Brothers & Sisters home functions much like that of a family, sharing responsibilities and spending time together when residents are home. Residents are encouraged to live as independently as possible and are responsible for showering on their own, taking care of personal hygiene, completing household chores, and attending a day program or job on weekdays. The apartments are equipped with major kitchen appliances, kitchen pantry, bathroom grab bars, emergency pull cords, intercom system, and patios/balconies. The buildings have a secured entry system, are equipped with elevators and the rent includes trash, water, sewer, and
